HISTORY OF THE LIVING ENDOWMENT FUND

As AMBUCS celebrates the 50th anniversary of the Living Endowment Fund, let's take a look back at the history of the fund.

In 1948, AMBUCS delegates adopted a national objective to aid children with cerebral palsy, known then as spastic paralysis. AMBUCS established a non-profit organization to collect and disburse funds for these children and called it the American Business Clubs Spastic Paralysis Fund, Inc.

The membership thought it was important to tell the children's stories and did so through financing a \$25,000 educational film on cerebral palsy called SEARCH. The membership took their fund-raising in earnest. More than \$15,360 had been raised by 1949. Thousands during the 20 years the film was available saw SEARCH

Members soon realized that not enough trained therapists were available to help children afflicted with cerebral palsy. To help fill this critical need, they developed in 1955 a national cerebral palsy scholarship program to assist qualified students in continuing their education in physical, occupational and speech/hearing therapy.

AMBUCS leadership sought a continuing source of income to fund the AMBUCS Scholars-Scholarships for Therapists Program. Because few members could afford to support the program if asked to give \$1,000 per person, leadership decided that the membership could easily each contribute the yearly interest a \$1000 investment could earn. This created the Living Endowment Fund. Members were issued shares of stock, which they pledged to pay the interest on annually. The contribution is now \$40 a year.
